We note that Aberdeen City Council and Aberdeenshire Council developed a regional transport strategy in 2008 and we hope that this is updated to include provisions within this Draft Noise Action Plan. Similarly we hope that local authority and Scottish Government colleagues working on this action plan work closely with air quality colleagues with the aim of integrating and developing both sets of action plans.

Environmental Protection Scotland would like to congratulate the Aberdeen and Dundee Noise Working Group and SENSG for producing clear, concise strategic noise maps from a multitude of data.

We would like to see both SENSG and the Working Group to proactively communicate this information to the public so that they are aware of what is happening in their region and to ensure that action planning is widely understood by the public.
